Autumn has well and truly arrived and the days getting shorter and colder. If you are walking your dog in the early morning or evening, please make sure you can be seen. Placing a reflective collar or jacket on your pet will make sure you are safe on the roads.

We are also getting close to firework season. If your pet is worried about fireworks, here there is some advice from to help keep your pets safe and stress free:

- Walk your dog during the day so they are tired during the evening.
- As soon as it gets dark keep your dog or cat inside. Ensure all of the windows and doors are locked including dog and cat flaps.
- Don't take your dog to a firework display. If you are going out then draw your curtains, put the television or radio on and provide your pet with a safe hiding place so they feel secure.

- Please make sure that your pets are wearing a collar with an identity tag on it in case they manage to escape from your home. We would also strongly advise that you have your pets microchipped as this enables us to reunite them with you much more easily should they run away. Please call the GSPCA for further details on having your animal microchipped (it's only £4.99!).

- When horses are startled they are likely to bolt and can suffer serious injuries. Ensure that all horses, ponies and donkeys are securely stabled with the doors closed.

- Remember to bring guinea pigs and rabbits inside or place them under cover in an out building.

- If you know that your pet is frightened by loud noises such as fireworks and has an existing heart condition please contact your vet for advice. They may suggest you try an Appeasing Pheromone such as ADAPTIL or Feliway diffusers or may discuss the use of sedatives; depending on your pet's needs. The GSPCA has a range of calming products on sale, for



up to 50% less than other outlets. Pop in and see us if you would like some advice.

- If you intend to have a firework party, please notify your neighbours, especially if they are elderly or have pets.
- Please clean up after firework parties. Litter is hazardous to domestic and wild animals.
- And finally, please NEVER let fireworks off near animals.

Bonfire night is always a worrying time for wildlife, as well as our pets. If you are having a private firework display then build your bonfire as late as possible to reduce the likelihood of any wildlife taking up residence. Before lighting the fire check the area thoroughly for hedgehogs. We are always saddened by the number of hedgehogs we receive that have suffered severe burns.

To reduced the impact of bonfire night on pets and wildlife, please try to attend a public fireworks display if you can.

New at the GSPCA!

While we wait for our new build, we are still trying to improve the quality of life for every animal we have on site. This year we have seen many parrots and small birds come through our door. A welcome addition to the shelter is the new aviary, built by Kip and his maintenance team, specially for the smaller birds, such as cockatiels and budgies. The inside area of our aviary used to be a shed. If you use your imagination it is possible to build animal enclosures simply and cheaply. Rosie and Jim, the cockatiels, and Rose, the budgie are now able to some much more natural behaviour and exercise. Since moving them into the aviary, they sing more, are more active and seem much happier birds. We would encourage any one who had caged birds to ensure they have a large enough area for them and if possible allow them out to exercise.



Corporate Days



The GSPCA offers corporate day for companies, where staff can spend a day volunteering at the shelter. At the end of August we saw 38 members of Northern Trust help at the shelter as part of Northern Trusts 'Community Partners' scheme.

The volunteers helped in all areas of the shelter, from walking dog to grooming rabbits and it was a pleasure to have them with us.



We also welcomed staff from KPMG back for the third year running. The seven staff helped out with the on-site maintenance, which included painting the stable, the tortoise and rabbit runs, fences and even doing a little gardening. While the majority of the staff are looking after the animals onsite, which can range between 200-300 animals, having help tidying up the shelter is a huge benefit.

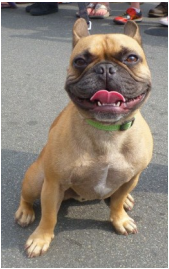

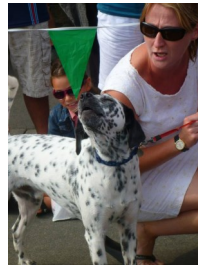

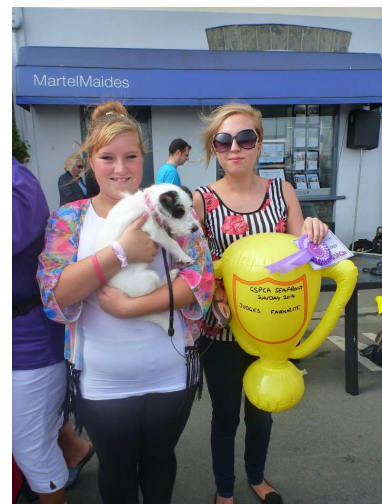

Our commercial washing machine at the GSPCA has broken down. After 10 years service, working from 7am til 7pm, it is no longer fixable and we are appealing for any help that can be given. We are currently shopping for single phase equipment that could deal with the blankets and towels that come from over 200 animals a day. We have a number of quotes coming in and it is likely that a 20kg machine will cost in the region of £5500. While we are trying to find a new machine all washing is being stored up and send offsite, which is far from an ideal situation.

We would be extremely grateful if we could find a sponsor to help with the costs of a machine. Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "Animal Shelters around the world rely heavily on their washing facilities and we would love to find someone kind enough to sponsor a new piece of equipment."

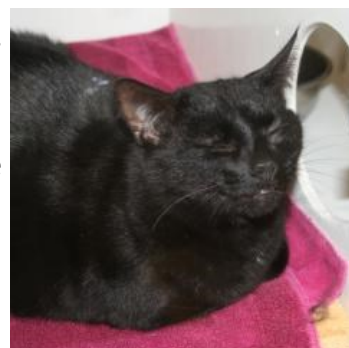
Jinx, pictured with our current washing machine, is one of many animals at the Shelter in our care, who benefits from the washing machine. We do not only need clean bedding to look after injured wildlife and animals looking for new homes, but also for pets that are boarding with us.



Animals come into the shelter for a variety of different reasons. We need to do the best we can for every animal that comes through our doors. On average it costs £15 to care for a dog, £10 for a cat, £6 for the smaller mammals. By sponsoring an animal pen you can help 1000's of animals that find themselves in the shelter each year.



Kenya and Mitzi are a couple of our long-stay cats. They have both been at the shelter for over a year. We are working hard to find these lovely cats a home, but in the mean time your sponsorship helps us give them a safe environment and the care they need.



Heather and her kits were an abandoned family of rabbits. Every year we had numerous stray rabbits that are never claimed. Before any of our rabbits are rehomed they will all be vaccinated, microchipped and neutered.



We also need to look after numerous species of wild-life. If this is where your interest lies, why not sponsor a hutch for a hedgehog, or an aviary for rehabilitating birds?

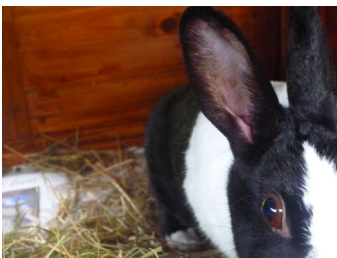


Animals in need of a home...

Heather (1 year) is a great family cat. She is good with children, cats and dogs, although she may take a bit of time to get used to you!



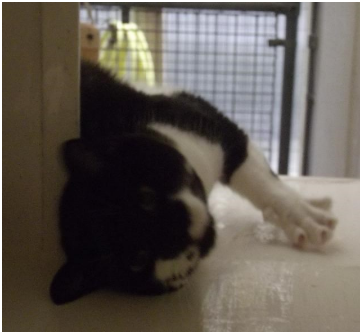

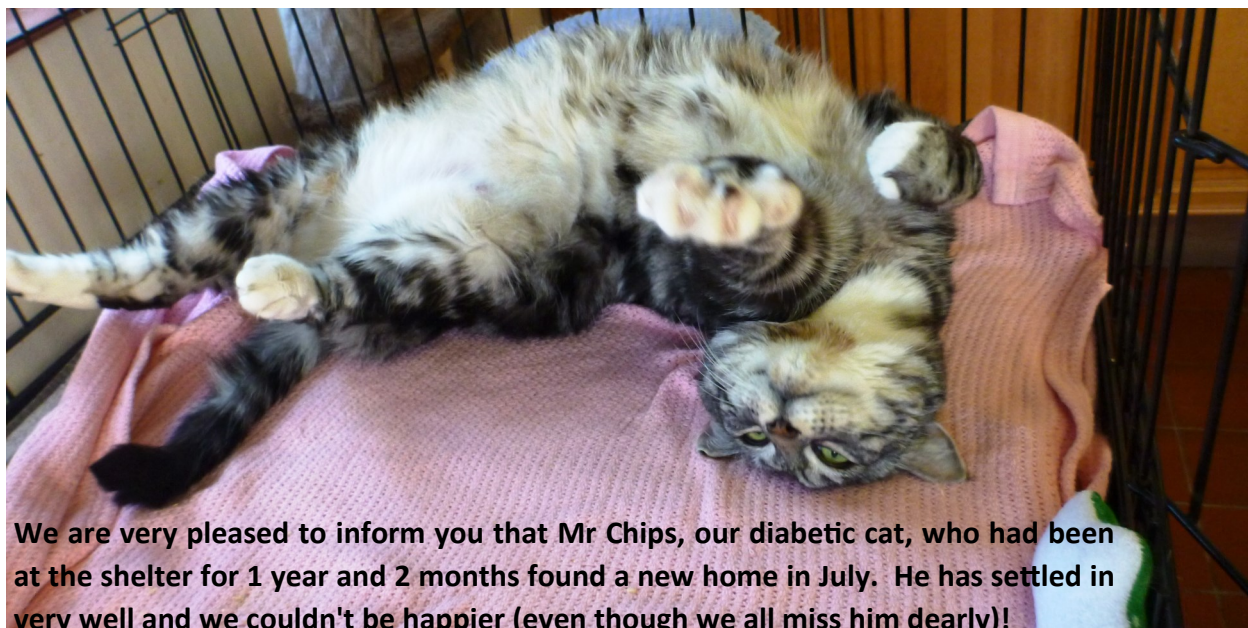


We have more animals available and other arriving all the time. Please visit our website or call the shelter if you are interested in any of them, or would like to arrange a visit.

We are very pleased to inform you that Mr Chips, our diabetic cat, who had been at the shelter for 1 year and 2 months found a new home in July. He has settled in very well and we couldn't be happier (even though we all miss him dearly)!



We also recently said good bye to Flower, who has settled in very well with her new family and is already very loved.

Wildlife



On the 1st August a barn owl with netting caught around her foot was rescued and brought to the GSPCA.

The bird was named 'Beau' and on closer inspection it was found that she had very badly injured legs, with the netting cutting deep through the skin. Beau was rushed to the vets, put on a series of treatments and returned to the Shelter where she was placed in an Intensive Care Unit.

After a couple of weeks of treatment Beau was strong enough to be placed in one of our soft release aviaries, where she was able to regain her strength.

Beau recuperated well and was released back to the area in St Peters where she was originally rescued on 27th August.



Yvonne Chauvel, a Senior Animal Care Assistant, was on site when Beau arrived and released her with the original finders. Yvonne said "It is so hard when we have injured birds of prey at the GSPCA as they can become so stressed that it can really make their situation much worse. Beau is one of the very lucky one's and thanks to the actions of the finders, the treatments from the vets and care here at the GSPCA we managed to get her back where she belongs and we even rung her in case she ever gets seen again we can know that she is doing well."

When injured barn owls are caught they play dead, which can be very concerning for the finders. You still need to take care though, as their feet are very strong. When picking up a barn owl it is best to wrap them in a towel or a jacket and get them into a dark box, then either transport them as quickly as you can to the Shelter or call us on 257261."

If anyone does see a barn owl in St Peters with a ring on its foot please do let us know as we would love to hear that Beau is doing well.





On the 17th September, Richard Klein from the Guernsey Sailing Trust spotted a kingfisher by the model yacht pond. The female bird, who was likely blown off course, was exhausted and dehydrated, but otherwise in good health. She was brought back to the shelter and is the first of its species to be rescued by the GSPCA as far back records can tell.

She was named Deborah (after the actress from the 'King and I') and responded well to treatment. After only 24 hours cage rest she was ready for release.

Deborah was taken to a release site in Castel, where there is a local population of kingfishers. After a few moments getting her bearings she flew off along the stream where she was released.

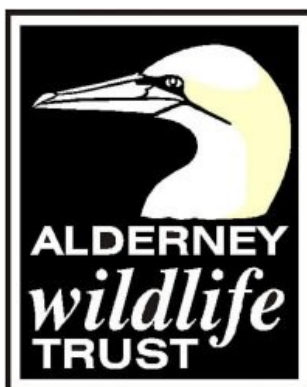
Geoff George, the GSPCA Animal Collection Officer said "Even working for an animal charity like the GSPCA it is very rare to get so close to a kingfisher and to rescue one and then release her back to the wild was a magical moment."



Muriel the kestrel came into the shelter on 20th July. She was rescued after being found in the middle of the road near L'Ancrese common, unable to fly. As she was very thin and weak, Muriel was placed straight into an intensive care unit when she arrived at the shelter. She quickly gained weight and strength. Muriel spent her last week at the shelter rehabilitating in our soft release aviary.

On 5th August she was rung and declared fit for release. Volunteer, Jo Sterring and Steve Byrne took Muriel the kestrel back to L'Ancrese common, where she was successfully released!

Caring for wildlife can be very challenging, and although we do all we can, we are not always able to save every wild animal that comes through the doors. Many wild animals become extremely stressed while in captivity and this can hinder their recovery. We have a close working relationship with vets and will consult them if we are concerned for any animal under our care.



Voluntourism!

This year the GSPCA has expanded its volunteer base by offering 'voluntourism' days to holidaymakers visiting Guernsey from the cruise liners. The initiative started after Steve Byrne listened to an interview on the JKT show on BBC Radio Guernsey regarding voluntourism. Steve contacted InterCruises and three dates were put in place. Passengers on the Crystal Serenity cruise liners were offered the chance to visit the shelter and help out for the day.

This offer proved to be successful and the GSPCA welcome three separate groups to the shelter. The volunteers were given a tour of the facilities (which also included a little Guernsey history). They were then able to help in the areas that interested them most. All areas of the shelter were available to them, from walking dogs, to hand-rearing baby birds. The volunteers left some fantastic feedback and really enjoyed their day with the shelter. We will be looking to run more voluntourism days next summer.



Come and see behind the scenes!

We are offering guided tours behind the scenes at the GSPCA. These tours will be running on the following dates at **2pm**:

We are asking for a minimum donation of £5 per person and £3 per child or £15 for a family of four, with a maximum of 15 people per tour.

The tours last around 80 minutes. The Christmas tours can also be brought as a gift certificate for a more unusual Christmas present!

We will be offering more tours during school holidays in 2015. Details will be posted onto our website as they become available.

As we have nearly 300 animals in our care, and have helped well over 2000 already this year, every penny really does help make a difference.

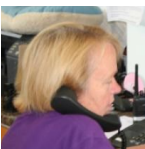

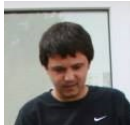

Thinking of getting a dog?

At the GSPCA we meet hundreds of people each year who are in the process of getting a new dog. We urge anyone who would like to get a dog to think carefully about what they want from their pet and which breed will meet their requirements. We don't believe that any breed of dog is 'bad' but that owners need to teach their dog the right lessons and ensure they are able to meet their dogs needs.

Think carefully about the reasons you want a dog; do you want a long to take on long walks? Or one that will be able to sleep on your lap in the evenings? How long will your dog be left for during the day? And do you have any other animals or children it will need to get along with? The answers to these questions will help you find the breed or cross-breed that will suit you. Some types of dogs are happy being left for long periods, where as other will become very anxious when left. A working cocker spaniel is going to need a lot more exercise than a Chihuahua. There can also be health benefits to owning a crossbreed. What ever type of dog you decide on, ensure that you are making the decision based upon behaviour and lifestyle, rather than looks. Talk to people who know the dog, whether that is kennel staff or breeders about the dog's personality so you can be sure it is the right dog for you.

We also ask that you consider rehoming a rescue dog before going to breeders for a puppy. Although we are very lucky with the amount of dogs looking for homes in Guernsey, there are hundreds of dogs going into kennels everyday across the UK. Many have done nothing wrong and there due to unfortunate circumstances. If you would like any advice on rehoming a dog or training a new puppy or rescue, please contact the GSPCA on 01481 257261.

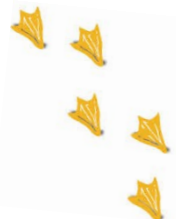
