# The GSPCA Springs into action

We have certainly started the new year at a running pace.

We continue to have large numbers of guinea pigs and rabbits brought in to the Shelter stray and unwanted all needing new homes.

We have had to deal with a number of oiled birds and birds injured through discarded fishing line and hooks which is frustrating and not needed.

Our first kittens were born in February at the Shelter and we would like to remind everyone about the importance of neutering.



We have launched a new range of pet tributes for those who have sadly lost their pets. In hand with this we have added additional pages to our website so you can both see these and if you need support due to the loss of a pet there is information on where you can find this.

We are hoping for some big developments in the next 12months as we are looking to build a new two story cattery, and add to our hedgehog and rabbit facilities.

This means it is going to be very challenging raising the much needed funds for these very large projects on top of the £500,000 it costs each year to run the Shelter.

# Microchipping March

The GSPCA receives dozens of stray animals every month and for many of these we are unable to reunite them with their owner because of lack of identification. While a collar with a tag may seem adequate many do become lost or simply fall off while the animal is wandering and when they arrive here we have no means of finding out who they belong to.

The GSPCA strongly advises people to microchip their pets as it gives them the best chance of being identified and returned to you if they become lost or stolen. The GSPCA is promoting Microchipping from the 1st

March during the run up to World Stray Day on the 4th April at the cost of £4.99 per dog or cat from Monday to Saturday 9am – 4.30pm (no appointment is needed) for more details call 257261.

Sadly he has been diagnosed with gingivostomatitis, a quite painful disease of the gums. Unfortunately there are a lot of contributing factors to the condition which means that Deacon will have to undergo lots of veterinary treatment until it can be brought under control. Sadly if the initial treat-

ments are not effective he may have to have most of his teeth removed all of which is likely to exceed £1000!.


