## Grand Opening at the GSPCA *A new era for visitors and supporters*



July 2016 marked a huge step and milestone in the history of the GSPCA as our New Multi Purpose Animal Welfare Building was officially opened.

Over 70 volunteers, staff, Build Partners, key supporters, Deputies, and VIP's attended the official opening which took place on Wednesday 27th July 2016 at 2pm. The reception started at 1.15pm and we must say thank you to Mr and Mrs Naftel for allowing us the use of the field to park the many vehicles.

The welcome drinks were kindly supported by Bucktrouts, food from Pelicans Cafe, trays of cakes from the Furze Oven and many other nibbles from wonderful supporters.

The GSPCA team have been working hard over the last few weeks in the run up to the event which despite a slight drizzle was well supported and a huge success.

At 2.05pm His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE CB, Patron of the GSPCA arrived with his family and were greeted by GSPCA President John Knight and GSPCA Manager Steve Byrne. His Excellency along with the GSPCA President and GSPCA Manager at 2.10pm made their way to the public entrance of the new facility which over looked the large crowd of supporters and the media to say a few words.

GSPCA President John Knight started by thanking His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE CB, for kindly opening the new facility and followed by thanking everyone for coming. John went on to explain the history of why

the building was needed and how grateful we were to so many, and especially the Build Partners for all of their support and the Association of Guernsey Charities.

GSPCA Manager Steve Byrne followed by explaining how the new building will transform the GSPCA, and from Thursday 28th July we will have sections open to the public to view animals in need of homes. Steve also thanked the many supporters in Guernsey that have enabled the build, businesses, groups, the staff and the volunteers all of which have made the new facility possible. He also gave a special thanks to St Andrews Floral Group for all of the wonderful conservation work on site before handing over to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE CB, Patron of the GSPCA.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE CB, made a wonderful speech about his experiences of the GSPCA and how his dog Milo enjoys staying at the Shelter's boarding facilities, he made reference to the international story of the dead cat that turned out to be a glove puppet before cutting the ribbon and raising a glass to the work of the GSPCA and the new facility. Flowers and a gift were presented as a way of thanks from the GSPCA who are hugely grateful to our Patron and his family for supporting our ceremony.

GSPCA Manager Steve Byrne and GSPCA President John Knight then took His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE CB, his family and a small party around the new facility where each section was explained. The state of the art building has many key features and has been designed with the welfare of animals in mind as well as the future challenges the GSPCA may face. Despite seeing

degu's to cats in need of homes the highlight and finale was seeing Olivia the loggerhead turtle on her last day at the Shelter as she flies on Thursday 28th July to Gran Canaria.

Staff took the many guests around the new build explaining the facilities and all had a wonderful afternoon and many kind words were passed on to the team.

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "We have had a wonderful day today at the GSPCA for our official opening of our new facility chatting to our many supporters and other guests from across the community here in Guernsey. It is a huge day in our 143 year history and we are hugely grateful to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE CB, Patron of the GSPCA for supporting us and making a fantastic speech before cutting the ribbon to the new facility."

"The new facility replaces 5 old buildings and gives us a building that is state of the art and multi purpose and has already housed the 25 Slovakian puppies and Olivia the loggerhead turtle."

"From 11am on Thursday 28th July we will have times where visitors for a small donation of £2 per person can come along and look around many of the animals in need of homes as well as a few of our residents."

"There are many more projects happening at the GSPCA and we look forward sharing the details of plans we have from future rebuilds to renewing the kennel floors many of which can be seen online on our wishlist."

"Thank you to everyone that made this day possible and all that supported us it was hugely appreciated."

# Olivia the turtle flies home



The GSPCA are excited to report that Olivia the loggerhead turtle is doing extremely well in Gran Canaria after being released back into the wild on Tuesday 6th September 2016.

Olivia, a large loggerhead turtle, finally traveled south at the end of July to complete the rehabilitation process prior to release in the warm waters off Gran Canaria which took place during August 2016. Olivia, who nearly died back in March was found in cold shock on a wintery beach on the west coast of Guernsey. If the GSPCA had not been alerted and been able to rescue her quickly she would have surely died.

Olivia was emaciated and severely dehydrated and had recently lost a front flipper, probably the result of a propeller injury. She was taken to the Animal Shelter in St Andrews where she has been expertly cared for, and nursed back to health.

Thankfully the team are very experienced with marine animals: they have been involved with caring for and rehabilitated seals (including 'Bonnie' the seal pup in 2016), dolphins and a green turtle ('Murtle') over 13 years ago, she was also taken to Gran Canaria. Olivia's chances were hugely helped by with local vet, GSPCA President and Senior

Veterinary Consultant for the Born Free Foundation John Knight, who has many years experience rescuing and caring for exotic and wild animals.

After being rescued from the 7C Guernsey sea, and a number of weeks in intensive care during which she was treated and slowly warmed, we managed to set up a pool at the Shelter thanks to the generosity of many local businesses. Within the pool she grew stronger every day, her appetite quickly returned and she eat everything that was put in front of her. Olivia enjoyed a wonderful diet, favourite being squid from Waitrose who were very kind in their support.

It took a few months to arrange, but in July she was ready to go: the legal documents had been stamped and signed off, including the international CITES legislation. The travel box (custom made to IATA standards) was complete, and on 28th July her journey took place. We flew her from Guernsey via Gatwick and on to her final destination Gran Canaria. PetAir Uk worked very closely with the GSPCA to find the best route for Olivia. The journey was made possible through the generous and kind support of both our wonderful local airline Aurigny and Thomson Airways who each helped us with her move.

Olivia's journey all went to plan and team members Sarah Ozanne, Steve Byrne and Geoff George were at strategic placed thanks to the support of the airlines to ensure the smooth move and hand over of the beautiful endangered turtle. GSPCA Manager Steve Byrne and Animal Collection Officer Geoff George were in Gran Canaria to hand over Olivia to team for Centro de Recuperación de Fauna Silvestre, go through her care whilst at the GSPCA, her behaviour and helped with her move to the fantastic centre in Las Palmas.

The GSPCA team were only in Gran Canaria for a few hours but in that time they spent it helping and learning about the 30 turtles at the Centro de Recuperación de Fauna Silvestre as well as helping to settle Olivia into her new temporary home. Olivia was at the Centre for just over a month and was doing so well it was decided to release her at 12.30pm 6th September 2016. She was released on a beach called Playa El Burrero on the southeast coast of Gran Canaria.

A huge thank you to everyone that has supported us in the care of Olivia and have contributed towards her trip south to the warmer waters where she belongs and especially to the team at Centro de Recuperación de Fauna Silvestre who are released her back to the wild.

Steve Byrne, GSPCA Manager said, "After months of care and the rehabilitation of Olivia, the loggerhead turtle were extremely excited at the GSPCA that to see her back in the wild where she belongs. Back in March Olivia would have surely died if she hadn't been rescued and had the care she received at the GSPCA. She was so weak, dehydrated and emaciated: she could not even raise her head."

"From what was a turtle taking potentially her last breaths, to seeing her lively and active nature is a joy and it was a joy to transport her at the end of July to the rescue centre called the Centro de Recuperación de Fauna Silvestre in Las Palmas, Gran Canaria where they have now released her back to the wild. Her care has been a testament to the caring and loving nature of the Guernsey community. We have had so many donations of things she has needed: from

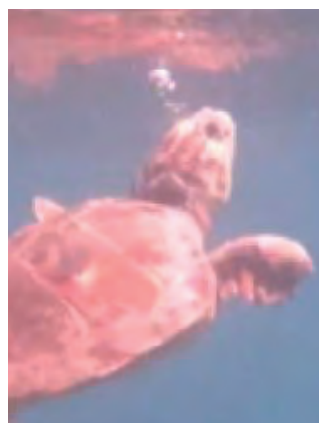
her pool from Spa de la Mare to the padding for her travel box from Graham Scott & Co."

"From the GSPCA to everyone involved we really appreciated all of the donations and support: from the sea water delivered at short notice by States Works, to the amazing veterinary services from the Vetcare Centres and Vets4Pets, not to mention all of the media support she has had to help raise the funds and items to care for her. We would also like to especially thank Waitrose for the squid that she enjoyed so much."

"It has been a huge undertaking looking after Olivia and finding the transport costs was without doubt been the biggest challenge, but thankfully with the help from Petair, Aurigny and Thomsons Airways, Olivia was able to head south. We had some sleepless nights at the GSPCA caring for Olivia and it was very emotional and tiring as we got Olivia to Gran Canaria in July and again emotions are running high as she in now back in the wild which we are so pleased to see."

Geoff George, Animal Collection Officer at the GSPCA who was also Olivia's rescuer and carer, said "It was a long journey to get Olivia to the point where she was able to fly to Gran Canaria after finding her so close to death on Vazon beach. It was wonderful to get her to where she belongs and to pass on how she was at the GSPCA and to know that

today she is now back in the wild makes all the sleepless nights worth while. We have all loved seeing the pictures and videos of her release and a special thank you to the team at Centro de Recuperación de Fauna Silvestre for the last month of her care and returning her where she belongs."





# FIREWORK ADVICE

## from the GSPCA

Every year we hear of firework related incidents involving animals and children. While fireworks may be exciting and pretty to look at and its fun to celebrate Guy Fawkes with a bang, we must put our safety and the safety of our pets and the local wildlife first. Over the coming weeks our Animal Welfare Team will be visiting islands' schools in an effort to promote the Fire work code and advise people how to keep themselves and their animals safe.

Lorna Prince GSPCA Welfare Manager said "Fireworks this year are being sold between 28th October and 5th November. People are encouraged to have displays on the 4th and 5th November. People are also encouraged to finish their firework displays before 9am and to let neighbours know, especially those with animals or pets."

"At the GSPCA we would encourage going to an organised events which are safer and will help reduce the stress and upset animals face during nights when fireworks are used."

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "Every November we see an increase in stray dogs escaping due to the noise made by fireworks and concerns raised by worried pet owners. Many enjoy the displays and sounds made by fireworks but it is important to ensure your animals and pets are safe and you consider the wildlife before running your own event."

"The GSPCA team will be speaking to all ages about the importance of safety and thinking of animals in the run up to the days fireworks are going to be used. Both the GSPCA and the States run an online firework calendar and we are asking for those organisers to let us know so we can put them on our calendar and alerts on our social media."

### The Firework Code

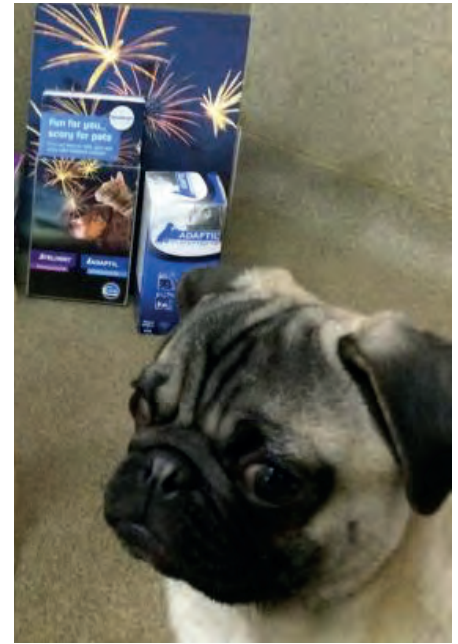
- Keep fireworks in a sealed box or tin
- Use them one at a time, replacing the lid immediately
- NEVER put fireworks in your pocket

- Read the instructions carefully, using a torch or hand lamp NEVER use a naked flame
- Light fireworks at arms length using a taper or a firework lighter
- Stand well back and NEVER return to a firework after it has been lit, it could explode in your face
- Ensure that all children with fireworks are well supervised
- NEVER throw fireworks
- Keep all pets and animals indoors
- Take care of sparklers, wear gloves to hold them and dispose of sparklers in a bucket of water as soon as they are finished

### The Animal Firework Code

The GSPCA would like to urge every one to follow our Animal Friendly Firework Code and protect your pets and the local wildlife.

- Please make sure that your pets are wearing a collar with an identity tag in case they manage to escape from your home. We would also strongly advise that you have your pets microchipped as this enables us to reunite them with you much more easily should they run away. Please call the GSPCA for further details on having your animal microchipped.
- Walk your dog during the day and as soon as it gets dark keep your dog or cat inside. Ensure all of the windows and doors are locked including dog and cat flaps.
- Go to an organised display if you can, however don't take your dog. If you are going out then draw your curtains, put the television or radio on and provide your pet with a safe hiding place so they feel secure.
- If you are having a private firework display then build your bonfire as late as possible to reduce the likelihood of any wildlife taking up residence. Before lighting the fire check the area thoroughly for hedgehogs. We are always saddened by the number of hedgehogs we receive that have suffered severe burns. Do not light fires or set off fireworks near trees where birds are likely to be roosting.
- Please notify your neighbours of your



intentions. Especially the elderly and those who have pets.

- When horses are startled they are likely to bolt and can suffer serious injuries. Ensure that all horses, ponies and donkeys are securely stabled with the doors closed.
- Remember to bring guinea pigs and rabbits inside or place under cover in an out building.
- If you know that your pet is frightened by loud noises such as fireworks or has an existing heart condition please contact your vet for advice.
- Please clean up after firework parties. Litter is hazardous to domestic and wild animals.
- Remember NEVER let fireworks off near animals.

### Help us to continue to keep them safe!

Thankfully the incidents of animals being injured by fireworks & bonfires in Guernsey are few and far between; but we mustn't get too complacent.

To notify us of your event please email the team at the GSPCA and we can add your firework display to our calendar. Please let us know the location, date and times it is planned for and also if it is public or a private event.

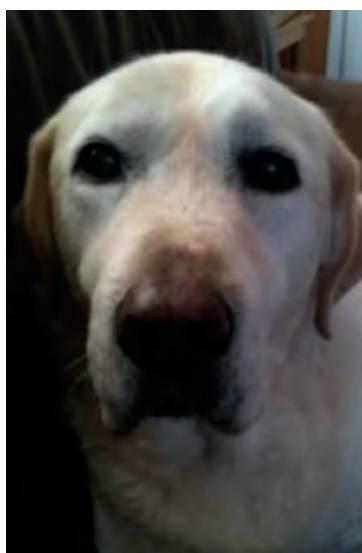

Tom McLagan GSPCA Animal Care Assistant rehomed Bob to his new owner on Saturday and said "It was lovely to see Bob go to his new home. His new owner was very happy to be taking him home and both looked very happy to have found one another."

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "We always find the older cats and those with medical conditions more difficult to find good homes at the GSPCA as often those looking to adopt prefer younger cats or kittens."

The young person that was asked to come along was nominated by the Youth Commission in Guernsey after being approached by the GSPCA to find a deserving young individual. Bethany from the the North Youth Centre was

nominated and was a fantastic help to the team of the GSPCA. Bethany has a keen interest in photography and was given a number of cameras to be the official GSPCA photographer for the day and pictures are to follow very soon.

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "What an amazing day we have had letting Bonnie go back to the wild in such a special place." "Jethou has been an amazing release site and where we have now with Bonnie released 5 grey seal pups that we have rescued, rehabilitated and released and we know some are still seen coming back."

"Bethany who was nominated by the Youth Commission after the winner of the Fattening Appeal for Bonnie was unable to come asked to give the

opportunity to join the release to a deserving young individual and Bethany was the lucky young lady was an amazing help and her photos will soon all be on line as well as her some videos."

"Bonnie was certainly the thinnest seal we have ever rescued and the thinnest I have ever seen and the moment she was released will be with all of us for the rest of our lives. We are so grateful at the GSPCA to all involved and especially to all from Jethou kind enough to allow us to visit and release her in a safe place, Island Rib Voyages for the amazing transport and of course to all that have helped support us with Bonnie the seal pups care."

Dan Meinke for Island Rib Voyages said "We thoroughly enjoyed helping with Bonnie's release. It's a fantastic opportunity to get involved with and we were thrilled when we were asked to help out. Its Bumblebee's second release and was a touching thing to witness Bonnie come to grips with the big wide world once again and she looked very happy."

Geoff George GSPCA Ambulance Collection Officer, rescuer and main carer for Bonnie said "Bonnie was so thin when we found her so many months ago. We really didn't think Bonnie would survive and today was very special and we are very thankful to those on Jethou for letting her be released in such a great site. To see her swim back where she belongs was fantastic."

On 21 September Gareth the Gannet was returned back to the wild after three weeks of rehabilitation at the GSPCA.

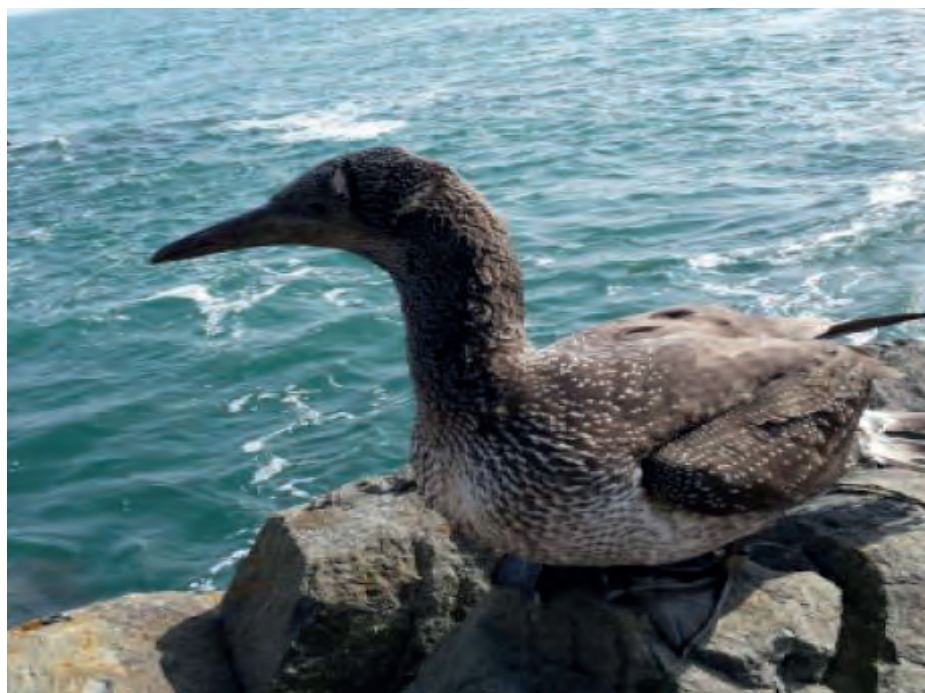
The young bird was rescued weak and thin at Port Soif by Animal Collection Officer Geoff George and spent over a week in our intensive care room for large sea birds and sea mammals until he was fit enough to be placed on to one of our rehabilitation pools. After nearly two weeks on our pools it was decided with his fitness much improved and the fair weather to release him on the north of Guernsey.

GSPCA staff member Kevin Beausire transported Gareth to a safe release site and managed to get a number of great pictures of Gareth heading back to the wild. Kevin said "It was lovely to see Gareth back to the open sea where he belongs after nearly a month of care at the GSPCA. He didn't fly straight off as he checked out his surroundings before taking a quick swim and he seemed very happy to be back in the wild."

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "At the GSPCA we help well over 1500 wild animals and birds every year and only a handful of those are gannets and it is wonderful when they are strong enough to make it back to the wild as sadly many of those injured by rubbish and fish netting often don't survive."

"It was great to see Gareth the gannet back where he should be and was released with a view of Alderney where they have a wonderful breeding colony of his species. Its amazing to know how gannets are doing in Alderney and the Alderney Wildlife Trust do a wonderful job monitoring them and tracking their movements."

Whilst at the GSPCA we discovered she was in fact diabetic and it took many months to get her treatment and diet to the right levels.

Monkey has a loving and wonderful kind nature although she is on a special diet and requires injecting twice a day.

Not only do we often struggle to find cats on treatment homes Monkey is also 10 years of age with older cats often passed by as many look to adopt kittens or younger cats.

Thankfully just over a week ago the moment came to wave Monkey off to a wonderful new home. It was an emotional time as many of the staff and volunteers are very close to Monkey and we have been recently sent pictures showing how well Monkey has settled in her fantastic new home.

Anna Paint Senior Animal Care Assistant said "One of my roles is running and caring for the cats at the GSPCA and over the last year I have grown very attached to Monkey who is such a wonderful cat."

"It's never easy finding older cats with health problems an owner and it was

wonderful when Victoria came forward to offer Monkey a lovely home. We actually have another diabetic cat called Bob in need of a home who is also a lovely friendly cat but needing that special someone."

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager "Every morning and evening at 8am and 8pm Monkey has to have a special diet followed by an insulin injection and we have all grown very fond of this amazing cat as myself and the team have all spent so much time with her."

"Monkey will truly bring her new owner a huge amount of joy and love and we are so pleased she is in a wonderful new home."

Victoria Heaviside who has recently adopted Monkey from the GSPCA said "Monkey is doing great. She marched out the basket when I got her home and has acted like she owns the place since! She's a very content little cat and loves having fuss and attention, once I've sat down she's in my lap as soon as she can be. She's so gorgeous it's such a shame she ended up with you guys for so long, although I am pleased I was able to have her! As you can see from the attached picture she is desperate to get outside and have a explore, getting in and out the house can be challenging at times and Monkey certainly suits her! Many thanks"

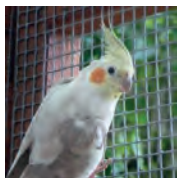

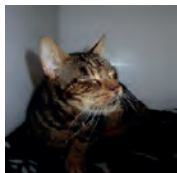

Because of his condition he needs to be a housecat only with no other pets present, (especially cats) and would best be suited to a home with teenagers only and no young children.

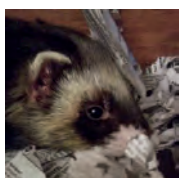

She loves learning and has been making great progress with the staff.



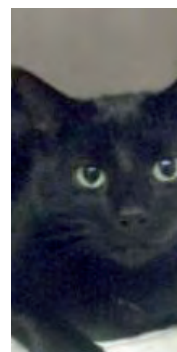
## **Lucy is looking for a new home**

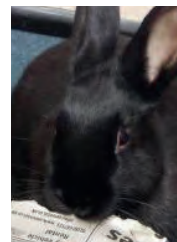
I still love to play (mice with feathers on are my favourite) and i can still put some of these youngsters to shame with my antics. If you think you can give me a home then please come and see me.



## **Mitzi looking for her forever home.**

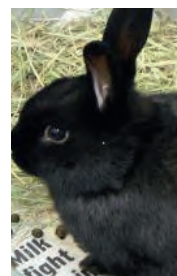
Age: 12 years

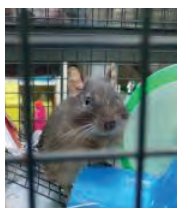

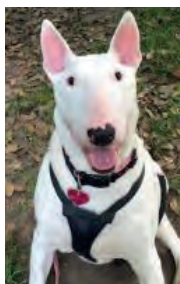

## URGENT APPEAL - Update the flooring in the GSPCA Kennels

Currently our most important project at the GSPCA is to improve and renew the flooring in the kennels at the Shelter. We have spent many years maintaining the floors and it is now time to look to replace those that we have to give them a long lease of life.

At the GSPCA we have 8 sections of kennels which range when they were built. All are in need of work and we are appealing for funds to help with this much needed project. Maybe you or your business would be interested in helping us with a section or donate to the project. We would happily look to dedicate a section to business or individual with a plaque and open to discussions in ways of support of this much needed project,

The flooring we are looking at would give the kennels at least 20 years with little maintenance and much easier to clean. With 1000's of dogs being cared for at the GSPCA kennels each year from rescues to strays, cruelty cases to those on their holidays, emergency boarders to seized animals we are kept busy 24/7 365 days a year.

Below are the costs per section including decorating the area. If we could get all of the floors completed at once it is likely we could achieve this with the exception of the hospital area for a total of £25,000.

We would really like to demolish an old building on site to build additional kennels which could have an area to be used exclusively as a rehoming block for unwanted, cruelly treated and stray dogs as well as others in need that we help. ## Refit and Enlarge the Reception Area at the GSPCA

## New floor and aviaries in our bird room

Our current bird room currently houses a selection of cages and has a very old lino floor. We would love to refloor it with a good quality replacement and build a number of aviaries so the stray and unwanted birds have permanent and large indoor enclosures. The floor with cost £1100 to replace and the aviaries will cost £1000 giving a grand total of £2100 if you would like to help with this wonderful project.

## Improve our seal pup facilities

Seal facilities need an update at the GSPCA Animal Shelter in Guernsey

In the last few years we have helped rescue, rehabilitate and release 5 seals back into local waters.

Although the current facilities we have at the GSPCA are suitable we are looking to dramatically improve and update them.

This would include renovating the intake room, improved drainage, filtration system and enlarging the pools we currently have for seal pups at the GSPCA Animal Shelter.

The cost to tile the room out and carry out the work would cost approximately be £20,000.



A smaller part of this project is to put a new floor and tile the wall of the intensive care room which will cost approximately £2000.

## New Washing facilities

Washing machine needed for the GSPCA Animal Shelter in Guernsey

In our new build we have a fantastic room ready for laundry equipment to be fitted.

We would like to add to our washing and drying facilities. The machines cost in the region of £4000-5000 each and we would really love to add a new commercial washer and dryer.

Due to the 300+ animals we have at the Shelter there is a lot of bedding and towels to be washed and the machine we have is often on for 12 hours a day 7 days a week. If you can help we would love to hear from you.

## Tile the Wildlife and Hedgehog Floors

To help improve the facilities we have for our hedgehogs and wildlife we would like to tile the floors and part of the walls in four areas of our wildlife unit.

The cost for the tile and accessories would be approximately be £2000 and the labour would be additional to this.

## New Tortoise Enclosure

We have 7 resident tortoise that enjoy the grounds at the GSPCA and we are currently looking to build a larger area for them to exercise and entertain our visitors. Before this can be built the area where it will be built needs a new retaining wall to replace an ageing section which will cost £1100 and to

build the enclosure will cost a further £500. To help us build a lovely new area for the tortoise and make safe the area where this bank is please do get in touch.

## GSPCA Ambulance & Rescue Vehicle

At the Shelter we operate an animal rescue service 24 hours 7 days a week. To provide this we have a GSPCA Ambulance thanks to the Itex Rotary Walk 2013 which is used by the Animal Collection Staff and Volunteer Night Wardens. Ideally we would like to ensure there is a second ambulance to help provide this service such as a minivan which would be ideal for the tight lanes we often have to drive through.

## Memorial Garden

We have an area where people come and sit to remember their pets and also scatter their ashes.

This is currently being improved thanks to the Sure Community Foundation, St Andrews Floral Group and others.

This is being made into a lovely area and we would like to add benches and a Summer Cabin to give those remembering their pets a safe and dry place to sit.

### Costs

Summer Cabin - £2500

Board/Benches - £1500

**Total - £4000**

To run the GSPCA we have to raise £2000 a day to help rescue, rehabilitate, reunite strays, rehome and release wildlife back to the wild over 3,000 animals a year.

#### Types of Legacies

If you would like to remember the GSPCA in your Will, there are three main types of gift you can make:

**Residuary Gift** - is the gift of all (or part) of the value of your estate after debts, liabilities and other legacies have been paid and is the most valuable kind of legacy to the GSPCA.

**Pecuniary Gift** - is the gift of a particular sum of money.

**Specific** - is the gift of a specified item that could be for example; property, a painting or a piece of jewellery.

#### Suggested wording for a gift in your Will

If you would like to leave the GSPCA a gift in your Will the following wording may be helpful when you visit your legal advisor:

*"I give all (or a % share of) the residue of my estate to the GSPCA (Guernsey Charity Number 003), Rue des Truchots, St Andrews, Guernsey GY6 8UD for its general charitable purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or duly authorised officer shall be a valid and appropriate form of discharge."*

#### Suggested wording for a codicil to the GSPCA

If you have already made your Will and decide that you would like to add a gift to the GSPCA, the following wording for a codicil may be helpful when you visit your legal advisor:

*"I (name) of (address) declare this to be my first codicil to my last Will dated (date). I give (details of legacy) to the GSPCA (Guernsey Charity Number 003), Rue des Truchots, St Andrews, Guernsey GY6 8UD, for its general charitable purposes and I direct that the Treasurer or duly authorised officer shall be valid and appropriate form of discharge. In all other respects I confirm my Will."*



#### Will making & Codicils

Making a Will, or adding a codicil to your existing Will is the only way to ensure that those you love will be taken care of, including your pets. If you have no immediate family, having an up to date Will allows you to make sure that your money benefits the people or causes that you really care about.

If your pet has brought huge joy into your life, remembering the GSPCA in your Will is a wonderful way to celebrate your love of our animal friends and help animals in Guernsey less fortunate than your own for many years to come.

As we receive no States funding, we're totally reliant upon the kindness of animal lovers in order to continue our work. Your lasting legacy will ensure that we can continue our work to help the thousands of animals that we care for every year and also plan for the future.

If you have already included a gift in your Will to the GSPCA, or intend to in the future, we would love to hear from you. Not only will this information allow us to plan for the future but more importantly it means that we can pass on our heartfelt thanks for your generous pledge. Your kind support will allow your love of animals to live on and save lives long into the future.



#### What you need to know

Making your Will is easier than you may think;

- Firstly, start by listing everything you could include in a Will including property, money and other assets.
- Then you must decide who you want to benefit from your Will (including the GSPCA if you wish), and make a list of their names and addresses.
- Decide who you wish to be executors of your Will. It is usual to have two executors, in case one isn't able when the time comes. They are usually family members or a professional advisor such as an advocate. If you wish, the GSPCA Manager can act as a co-executor of your Will.
- Take all of these details along to the advocate, who will draw up a Will for you. We strongly advise that you do not attempt to 'do it yourself'. A 'home-made' Will can often lead to trouble as it may be ruled invalid by the courts if it fails to

#### Already made a Will?

Many people make a Will and assume that's all they need to do. However, circumstances can change over the years and so it is always advisable to take a fresh look at your Will every few years to ensure it meets your current needs.

#### Changing your Will

If you have already made your Will and decide that you would like to add a gift to the GSPCA, a codicil is a good, inexpensive way to do so. Adding a codicil to your Will enables you to leave a legacy to the GSPCA whilst ensuring that the other provisions remain untouched and you won't have to pay for your Will to be completely rewritten.
