01481 257261 **★**GSPCA It's certainly been a busy start to the year for the team at the GSPCA, but especially for Head of Marine Life Geoff George with a total of six seal pups keeping him occupied!

All six pups were indeed of hand feeding when they arrived and slowing Geoff has been nursing them back to health, with the help of veterinary professionals and the team at the shelter.

We currently have an Urgent Fish appeal to help our seal pups for ideally mackerel or herring but any sea fish that has been caught in the last 3 months would be hugely appreciated.

The seals are eating at least 20-30 fish each per day we are going through over 150 fish a day and with the recent rough weather many fishermen that support us have been unable to go out.

Steve Byrne continued "All six seal pups continue to improve each day and we will of course keep everyone up to date on their progress as they become ready for release.

"A healthy grey seal pup should look like a fat sausage and you shouldn't be able to see a neck, but if in doubt please send a picture in or give us a call.

"Often healthy seal pups will have their Mother watching them from out at sea and it is people that has scared them off, so please do keep your distance and your dogs under control.

"We are hugely grateful to all that have donated blankets and towels to help the seals and we are still appealing for more to help them and the many animals at the GSPCA and we also continue to appeal for fresh fish and donations to help these poorly seal pups."

The GSPCA would like to thank everyone who has donated fish so far with a special mention to Solent Claims LTD, Mike Ward and Manor Farm Food.

Last year, the Co-op supported the Jersey Society for Prevention



of Cruelty to Animals' (JSPCA) #SaveOurShelter campaign by donating 5% of pet food sales to the Animals' Shelter.

The Society is now launching the same initiative in Guernsey where funds raised during April and May will go towards supporting the seal pups within the GSPCA's care.

Steve Byrne, Manager at the GSPCA, said: 'We are hugely grateful to the Co-Op for supporting us in raising funds to help feed the six seal pups at the GSPCA. It is unprecedented in the GSPCA's history that we have had this many seal pups being rehabilitated at the shelter. The pups are very lucky to be alive as they were all suffering from starvation and had a variety of injuries and ailments when they were rescued. Thankfully, they are now all on the road to recovery. Some of the pups will be with us until after the spring once the weather has improved and they're at a suitable weight then they can be returned to the waters where they belong.

The Channel Islands Co-operative Society's Chief Operating Officer Mark Cox, said: 'We are delighted to support the GSPCA's Save Our Seals campaign. As a community retailer, we want to make a real difference to our Island communities and offer our support wherever we can.

"The GSPCA is a fantastic charity that does such important work by providing a service to animals in need of care. We hope the 5% of profits from pet food will raise sufficient funds to help rehabilitate the seal pups back to health.

Andrew Number 1 Arrived: November 2018

Location: Jersey

In November a young grey seal pup 'Andrew' washed up in Jersey and was quickly transported to the GSPCA for urgent care. Andrew was extremely thin at 17kg and the youngest pup we had seen in many years. We'd expect seal pups of this age to be around 40kg so he was in need of intensive care.






Marty Number 2
Arrived: December 2018
Location: Jersey, Green Island Beach
Marty was the second poorly seal
pup to be rescued from Jersey and
treated at the GSPCA.
Marty was rescued by the Jersey
British Divers Marine Life Rescue on
Green Island beach. He spent the
night at New Era Vets and was
transported kindly by Blue Islands
from Jersey to Guernsey.

He was only 18kgs and was much older than Andrew that arrived in November. Despite him being rescued between 6 to 8 weeks of age he had a number of ailments from a chest infection to his emaciated condition.

Gully Number 3 Arrived: December 2018 Location: Guernsey, Vazon

A dog walker spotted 'Gully', the first washed up seal pup of 2019, Gull, quite high on the rocks at Vazon. The poorly seal pup was found to have weepy eyes, nose discharge, dehydrated and a number of other injuries on its body and flippers.

Selia Number 4



Arrived: January 2019

Location: Guernsey, Route de Pulias (Smelly Pond)

A GSPCA Volunteer Warden was the first to arrive on the scene to help Selia the sick seal pup who was spotted near Route de Pullias in the Vale. Sealia who was only 4 weeks when she was found underweight, dehydrated and with a number of injuries. She was rushed back to the GSPCA to start having intensive care.



Mambo Number 5 Arrived: February 2019 Location: Guernsey, Fort Doyle Mambo was found very late in the seal pup season just when we thought 4 would be all that would need help this winter!

Mambo was rescued at Fort Doyle and was also a very thin poorly pup. He had a chest infection, discharge and went straight to Geoff at the intensive care area for seal pups at

the GSPCA.



It's been a busy and exciting start to 2019 for us here at the GSPCA!

See below some of our highlights from the first quarter:

Full Planning Notification for the proposed Wildlife Hospital – help this build become a reality!

At the end of February the States of Guernsey Planning Department gave the approval for the plans for the proposed new Wildlife Hospital at the GSPCA.

This much-needed facility is planned to replace a number of old buildings, some which date back to the 1940's.



We launched a fundraising campaign last year for the facility and now the planning has been granted raising the £900,000 needed is our priority.

With just over £50,000 pledged or raised so far there is still a long way to the total funds required to build the GSPCA Wildlife Hospital.

GSPCA were thrilled to see that the States of Guernsey banned the sale of Metaldehyde in January!

Metaldehyde is an organic compound and is commonly used as a pesticide against slugs, snails, and other gastropods and is extremely dangerous to our wildlife as if consumed can be lethal. It has been estimated that consumption of just 5g of

slug pellets containing 50-60g Metaldehyde per kg pellets is potentially lethal to a hedgehog and is dangerous to many other species of domestic and wild animals.

Purple Week celebrates 146 years of the GSPCA and raises £2500!

Each year on February 14th the GSPCA celebrates its anniversary and this year we celebrates 146 years helping what are often the unloved animals in Guernsey.

Throughout the week we had a number of initiatives that aimed to raise awareness of the broad range of work we do helping wildlife and domestic



animals, as well as raising much needed funds.

It costs nearly £2,000 a day to care for all of the animals at the Shelter and provide the 24/7 service 365 days a year.

Thank you to everyone who supported the 2019 Purple Week we had a great week hosting events, receiving gifts and support from volunteers to help local animals.

We were able to finish the week by awarding an incredible 71 certificates to GSPCA staff, volunteers, Work to Benefit placements, supporters and amazing helpers all voted for by the GSPCA community and supporters.

Steve Byre GSPCA Manager said "We have an incredible team at the GSPCA and each quarter throughout 2019 we will issue certificates to team members and everyone can get involved and help by sending in kind words and today was the first occasion of this year.

"This year's Purple Week raised £2500 and all the funds will be used to support animals including our six seal pups, and the cats, dogs, guinea pigs, rabbits and reptiles staying with us until they find their forever homes.

Steve's Wildlife Advice – Baby Birds

With spring well underway the GSPCA are asking Islanders to please be mindful of the many fledglings popping up around the Bailiwick.

The GSPCA would like to remind that as a general rule, it is best to leave baby birds alone.

A baby bird has a greater chance of survival in the wild than it has being hand-reared by man as they learn to fend for themselves and how to forage for

food by their parents. Around 2 weeks after hatching young birds in your Bailiwick garden usually leave the nest, just before they learn how to fly.

It is about this time that you find a young bird out of its nest, as it is probably a fledgling. Fledglings are almost fully feathered, able to walk, run and hop on to low branches, and will try to hide in undergrowth where they are fed by their parents. Parent birds are not usually far away and are probably collecting food but will not return until you have gone. Within a day of leaving the nest, fledglings can usually fly enough to keep up with their parents and escape predators.

Please remember to only move them, or encourage them to move, a short distance to safety if they are in immediate danger.

If you have picked up a fledgling, put it back as near as possible to the place you found it. Don't try to return a fledgling to its nest as you may disturb other young birds.

If you are concerned about its safety try to put it nearby on a ledge, or somewhere it will be out of the reach of cats. Monitor the situation from a place where you will not been seen or heard as otherwise you may continue to discourage the return of the parents. Do this for at least two hours. You will almost certainly find that the parents have taken care of their youngster within this time.

If, after monitoring, you think a fledgling is genuinely orphaned or sick please call the GSPCA on 01481 257261 and choose the emergency option or bring it to the Animal Shelter where we have hospital cages set up ready for them. Please do not try and care for these birds yourself. If you need further help and advice, again please call us on 01481 257261.

We have already had a number of baby birds including finches, pigeons and ducklings this year.

Nestlings are baby birds that only have a small number of feathers. They are different from fledglings in that they are totally dependent on the security of the nest and will not fare at all well if left.



If a nestling is found, contain it as soon as possible in a warm, dark, well-ventilated cardboard box (do not offer water, milk or food as this could make them ill or if done incorrectly worse).

Never try to return nestlings to their nests as this may disturb the other babies. Never try to rear nestlings yourself, as they need specialist care if they are to survive and our staff have years of experience and training.

Steve Byrne GSPCA Manager said "Once again Spring is with us and as with every year it is a busy time for the GSPCA, especially as we have healthy fledglings brought in that their parents could have cared for and raised.

"Recently we have had fledglings, a baby goose and ducklings brought in to add to those already in our care, and as the summer approaches we are often inundated with orphaned fledglings.

"It is a worry when baby birds are seen with no parents in view, but this simple advice can mean they can have the best start in life.

"We are very lucky to have intensive care units at the Shelter to help raise these very fragile young, but it is never easy with the number of feeds and the fact that many arrive injured or very cold.

"After a stormy start to the year, it is great to see a kinder Spring to our wildlife and fingers crossed they have a good year."

Please remember handling any animal domestic, wild, dead or alive may be potentially hazardous. Obvious dangers include bites, scratches and general hygiene issues. The GSPCA advise common sense should be applied in all instances and if unsure please call 01481 257261. Personal hygiene should be taken into consideration after handling any animal whether it is domestic, wild, dead or alive.

Sadly when the scan was done it showed a tumour in her heart (Chemodectoma) and due to this we are looking for a fantastic foster home for Smudge to go to where she will be spoilt rotten for the length of time she has left.

Smudge will need close monitoring so requires a foster home where someone is always around and also needs to be the only pet in the household with no children or visiting children.

Smudge will require to be a housecat only and will need grooming as we are a fluffy cat but like her personality she is wonderful about having this done as well. If you are interested in being a foster parent then please contact the GSPCA on 257261. A home check will be required.


